SYLLABUS
ITEM:

The paper for the evening was prepared by Mr. James Hunt Deacon of Adelaide and was entitled "Slang Terms for Coins and Currency". Mr. Deacon who is an authority on this subject, prepared a vast amount of material in covering the letters from A to N.
