# **REPORT OF THE 500th MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, 5th APRIL, 1977, AT THE THEATRETTE AND CONFERENCE ROOM, NATIONAL MUSEUM, MELBOURNE.**

The **President**, Mr. Phil Downie opened the meeting at 8.15 p.m., welcoming all present to this milestone occasion, and in particular greeting a number of older Members who had not been able to attend regular meetings.

THE ARCHIVIST, Mr. Len HENDERSON presented a paper entitled "SOME OF OUR HISTORY". Mr. Henderson traced the history of the early Numismatic Society of Victoria, founded in 1914, until its affiliation with the Historical Society of Victoria in 1931. He further detailed events leading to the dis-affiliation and the subsequent formation of the N.A.V. in 1946.

THE GUEST SPEAKER, MR. JOHN GARTNER, a Past President, spoke on early collecting days, the present, and the trends for the future. These reminicences brought a touch of nostalgia to the hearts of the older members present.

THE VOTE OF THANKS, was moved by a Past President, Mr. Bill Purnell, who warmly thanked Mr. Gartner on behalf of all present.

TWO COMPETITIONS had been arranged on the themes of "THE OLDEST NUMISMATIC ITEM" and "NUMISMATIC ITEMS RELATING TO '500' ".

The judges announced that the respective winners were Miss Jean Harwood and Mr. Peter Wall. The President presented both with a small memento.

A special Commemorative Medallion had been struck to mark the occasion and also to honour the 25th year of reign of Queen Elizabeth II. Mr. Ray Jewell explained the circumstances surrounding the striking of this medallion. The original obverse die: of this medallion was used, coupled with a reverse die bearing the words "COMMEMORATING THE 25th YEAR OF THE ACCESSION OF HER MAJESTY ON THE OCCASION OF THE N.A.V.'s 500th MEETING 5th APRIL 1977". Only 110 of the 38mm silver-plated medallions were struck of which 20 have been reserved for sale to Country, Interstate or Overseas Members. The price is \$8 each, or \$9 posted.

The President announced that a souvenir memento of the occasion would be given to :--

- (1) Those present who had attended the **FIRST** N.A.V. Meeting.
- (2) **JUNIOR** members present.
- (3) Persons present who had travelled over 100 km to attend.
- (4) Presidents of other Numismatic Societies present.

Those in attendance who qualified were presented with a souvenir spoon bearing the badge of the Association.

Mrs. Betty Turvey was then asked to come forward and light the candles on the "500th Meeting" cake.

Mr. Norm Adams, the 3rd N.A.V. President, was asked to come forward and cut the cake.

Sample Bags were then given to each person present. These contained approximately 26 items comprising both useful items and interesting souvenirs of the evening. The Sample Bags were a real surprise, and naturally were enthusiastically received by all.

The President closed the Meeting and asked that everyone view the exhibits which had been specially displayed in the foyer, then to partake of the **Catered Supper** beautifully spread out in the Conference Room adjoining.


# **POST - SCRIPT TO THE 500th MEETING**

# "SOME OF OUR HISTORY"

(Continuing from page 12 of the last issue, the brief account of the Association compiled and read out by Mr.Len Henderson at the 500th Meeting).

In December 1923 members were entertained by Mr. LeSouef at the Melbourne Branch of The Royal Mint where they were privileged to see the large and beautiful collection of coins and medals numbering over 7,000 pieces comprising coinage from nearly every country in the world. There were a great many medals, both British and Foreign, and both decorative and commemorative. An added charm, according to at least one of the viewers, was to see a collection so well displayed.

On other occasions Mr. Chitty, Numismatist to the Public Library, entertained members in his own home where they could view his own collection at leisure and more importantly receive a talk of high educative value. Mr. Chitty had come to Melbourne where he had classified and arranged that Museum's collection. On two or three occasions in the early years of the Society's existence they had approached the Trustees of the Library to appoint a Curator of the State Collection of unclassified, valuable, coins and medals. The Trustees were successful in obtaining the services of Alfred Chitty. One of the features of this collection is the section devoted to Greek coins, which number about 1,000 pieces exclusive of the vast range of Electrotypes. The Roman section is equally representative and supplemented by an exceptional collection of wax impressions. Mr. Chitty generously donated his own collection of Uncirculated Australian where every coin was duplicated so that obverse and reverse could be displayed side by side. Thirty five years ago I remember seeing these coins "stuck" to the backing of the vertically mounted wall-cases in the Mezzanine Gallery where the Weapons are now on display. Unfortunately, over a period of time much substitution was made, with V.F. pieces taking the place of the Uncirculated and Proofs. A person who was responsible for the mounting of Reptiles in the Museum was later Charged, and Convicted, of the Larceny of some of the coins but of course they could not be regained. The theft was only discovered when Spink and Son in London wrote to the Trustees saying that they had been receiving parcels of scarce and rare coins from a collector in Melbourne and that they had never heard of this person before as a collector; could the Museum give them any background material on a Mr. A. Massola? The Museum could, and did, and Charges were laid leading to a conviction. It was already strongly suspected that much substitution had been taking place and Ray Jewell had called on the Trustees to talk about this before the news came through from England. This took place in the Post-War years after Fritz Schafer had retired and there was no one officially looking after the Collection. This was about 1963.

One very strange fact that has emerged since John Sharples took over as Numismatist is that there has come to light a few coins that should not be there at all – an extra Adelaide Pound and a Canadian Pattern that doesn't exist in the Ottawa Mint Museum collection!

# GIFT TO ASSOCIATION ARCHIVES.

The original engraved metal block used for printing the crest of the Numismatic Society of Victoria has been generously donated to the N.A.V. by Jenkin Buxton Printers Pty.Ltd.

The crest, shown here, was adapted for use by the Association and the central portion of the original crest used on the cover of all issues of "Australian Numismatist" since 1946. Our Archivist, Mr. Len Henderson, has the block in his care but it may be viewed by any member on request.



BUSHRANGER MEDAL. The colony of New South Wales awarded medals in gold and silver to police and citizens who displayed bravery in capturing or resisting bushrangers.

The medals were awarded in the years 1863-1875. A total of 15 medals were awarded. These comprised a small number of different types, each of which is either unique or very rare considering that only 15 medals in all were awarded.

#### **REPORTS OF OTHER MEETINGS.**

THE 501st GENERAL MEETING was held on Friday, 15th April, in the Theatrette of the Science Museum.

At 8.00 p.m. the President, Mr. Phil Downie, opened the meeting and welcomed the 24 members and 4 visitors present.

The SYLLABUS for the evening consisted in a QUIZ prepared by Mr. Reg Williams. Question sheets were handed out for members to test their knowledge of Numismatics. Prizes went to Peter Wall and to Master Adam May (JUNIOR SECTION).

Reg was thanked for his work in preparing the quiz.

An APPLICATION OF MEMBERSHIP was received from W.D. DARCY of South Caulfield, Victoria.

During **GENERAL BUSINESS**, Mr. Frank Heard requested that a minute of appreciation be recorded for those who helped organise the 500th Meeting. Approval was given by spontaneous acclamation.

Mrs. Betty Turvey thanked the many members who had commented favourably to her on the 500th Meeting.

Mr. John Sharples gave a brief talk on the current situation in the Numismatic Section of the Science Museum, mentioning recent aquisitions and finds.

The MEETING was then closed for supper and all were invited to view Peter Wall's fine display of Ancient Egyptian Coinage in the foyer.

The 502nd GENERAL MEETING was held in the Conference Room at 8.00 p.m. on Tuesday, 3rd May. The meeting was opened by the President, Mr. Phil Downie, who welcomed the 40 members and 6 visitors present.

Mr. Howard Jenkin then proceeded with the SYLLABUS ITEM, a paper he had prepared entitled "GASBAGS". He gave a short account of the history of airships from the hot-air balloons of the Montgolfier Brothers in France in the 18th Century to the enormous, but illfated dirigibles (eg. the Zeppelins), to the modernday propane-gas heated balloons. Howard then spoke on the numismatic items he had brought along to illustrate his historical account. Members enjoyed viewing the large display which aroused considerable discussion.

During GENERAL BUSINESS greetings from Grant Musgrove, in Tasmania, were conveyed by Tom May who had met Grant in Hobart a few days earlier. The meeting was then closed for supper and a very successful tender sale.

THE 503rd GENERAL MEETING was held in the Theatrette of the Science Museum on Friday, 20th May. The President, Mr. Phil Downie, opened the meeting at 8.00 p.m., welcoming 33 members including Mr. Robert Kaldor, recently returned from a trip to Europe, and 6 visitors. The SYLLABUS ITEM was presented by Mr. Rick Williams from Monash University who spoke on "The Athenian Coinage Decree". After a brief introduction, Mr. Williams ran a film he had compiled which transported the audience back in time to the atmosphere of Athens in the mid 5th Century B.C. The guest speaker then used slides to trace the development of the "OWL" of Athens which gained widespread use since the purpose of the Decree was to limit the striking of coins by those lesser states within the Athenian league. In all, the guest speaker combined a very good commentary with an excellent visual presentation of the subject matter.

Passing a vote of thanks on behalf of the members, Mr. Peter Wall remarked that Mr. Williams lecture would be worthy of inclusion in the official programme of Greek Festival Week then being held in Melbourne. All members joined in a warm round of applause for the young guest speaker.

# NEW NOTE PRINTING WORKS.


The Reserve Bank of Australia has accepted a tender of \$1,874,000 from Lewis Construction Co. Pty.Ltd. for the first stage of the construction of the new Note Printing Works at Craigieburn.

The work to be carried out in this initial contract includes:

- a) site preparation and excavation for the production and service buildings;
- b) foundations for the production building including service tunnels;
- c) internal road system and carpark;
- d) stormwater, water supply and sewerage systems;
- e) outer perimeter security fence.

The contractor was given possession of the site on 3 November and commenced work on site on 8 November. The contract provides for completion by 3 August, 1977.

Documentation of the main contract should be available for the calling of tenders in the first half of 1977, to allow the main construction work to commence immediately site works are completed.
